BEAD Program Update

Final Proposal Submission

MBO submitted Montana's Final Proposal to NTIA on September 3, 2025

NTIA Approval

NTIA announced approval of Montana's Final Frozeral on November 18, 2025

NIST Approval

Montana's Final Proposal still requires to proval from NIST, but this is not expected to be a long process

Grant Agreements and Post-Award Activities

• Preparing updated draft grant agreement, reimbursement policy, and post-award monitoring and compliance procedures; as updates are available, they will be posted to the ConnectMT website



ConnectMT ARPA Program Background

Initial program awards were announced in 2022

- Subgrantees must complete their projects by Septemper 30, 2026
- The ARPA program must be completed by December 31, 2026

About \$310 million in grant funds were awarded

Awards came from a combination of CPF at a 2' FRi program funds

56 awards were made to 16 different subgrantees

- The CAC implemented an award cap, i niting the amount given to a single awardee to 35% of the ARPA funds
- The CAC also passed a motion to allow DOA to award unallocated/defaulted funds to the "next-in-line" applications that were not awarded during subgrantee selection process

Awards will serve about 60,000 locations and deploy 2,000+ miles of fiber

Several project defaults have resulted in the need to reallocate unused program funding



ConnectMT ARPA Lightning Round

Treasury has allowed Montana to run another round of subgrantee selection (the Lightning Round) to reallocate remaining program (ands

- Treasury required the same scoring criteria and technical requirements as used in previous rounds of ARPA subgrantee selection
- The new awards are still subject to the progrem end data of September 30, 2026


About \$18 million of ARPA funds are vai able to be re-allocated

Following BEAD awards, Montar a has 4,340 BSLs eligible for ARPA funding

- 2,017 BSLs from defaulted ARPA projects
- 2,023 BSLs eligible from BDC Map Fabric v6, but not allowed in BEAD by NTIA

ARPA Lightning Round Scoring Criteria

The Lightning Round scoring criteria match the criteria from the original subgrantee selection process

ConnectMT ARPA scoring rubric (maximum of 130 points)

15 Points: Matching funds

20 Points: Service designation of project long alons

6 Points: Demographics of project locations

30 Points: Scalability of network

5 Points: Speed of deploymer (

10 Points: Jobs created

10 Points: Existing infrastructure

34 Points: Additional community commitments



ARPA Lightning Round Results

The Lighting Round application period was open from October 20th through November 3rd

Montana received 6 eligible applications

- Each application was fiber-only in compliance with Lightning Round requirements
- \$18.8 million in total grant requests
- 200+ miles of fiber proposed
- 2,772 BSL proposed

2 applications had overlapping BSLs

• This overlap was substantial with the lower-scoring application eligible to receive less than 1% of its total proposed BSLs and sudges

This results in 5 application eligible for award

- \$16.2 million in total grant requests
- 160+ miles of fiber
- 1,488 BSLs







ARPA Program Next Steps

DOA seeks approval from the CAC to reallocate \$16.2 million in ARPA funding to the 5 identified projects as new awards

At least \$1.8 million in ARPA funding remains to be regulocated

- DOA is not expecting additional defaults
- If any remaining projects come in under but got, an 'itional ARPA funds will be available to be reallocated

Treasury will allow Montana to directly and the second ARPA award contracts to reallocate the remaining funds by adding additional sugifies SSLs to those projects

- This is a process that other stars are implementing to expend grant dollars
- Treasury has advised against furt, er ounds of subgrantee selection due to program time constraints

DOA seeks approval from the CAC to reallocate any remaining program funds at its discretion through the amendment of active ARPA award contracts

 DOA would use a structured framework for this outreach that prioritizes projects with substantial completion and high-performing ARPA program awardees
